The total number of verses in the Quran is **6348**. This includes 112 unnumbered بِسْمِ اللّٰهِ الرَّحْمٰنِ الرَّحِیْمِ (*In the name of Allah the most Compassionate, most Merciful*), also known as Basmalahs, which occur at the beginning of the Suras. Without the **unnumbered** Basmalahs, the total number of verses in the Quran is **6236**.

Note that بِسْمِ اللّٰهِ الرَّحْمٰنِ الرَّحِیْمِ starts all Suras, except Sura Tawba (Chapter 9) (which does not contain بِسْمِ اللّٰهِ الرَّحْمٰنِ الرَّحِیْمِ at all, but this *Basmala* occurs *within* Sura Al-Naml (Chapter 27) in verse 30, where it prefaces a letter from Prophet Solomon to Bilqis, the Queen of Sheba. Furthermore, Sura Al-Fatiha (Chapter 1) is the only Sura

So, the total number times بِسْمِ اللّٰهِ الرَّحْمٰنِ الرَّحِیْمِ is mentioned in the Quran is 114 (112 times unnumbered at the beginning of 112 Suras + 1 time numbered at the beginning of Sura Fatiha + 1 time inside Sura Al-Naml).
